Visitation will be held at Mathis Funeral Home in Dexter on Tuesday, July 26, 2022, from 5:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m.

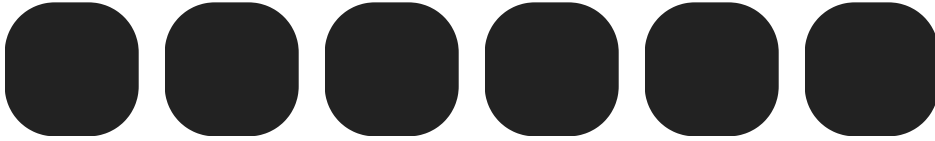

The family would like to thank Terry and Kathy Crow of Mulberry Manor and the staff of Elara Caring Hospice for the tender and compassionate care given to Dimple.

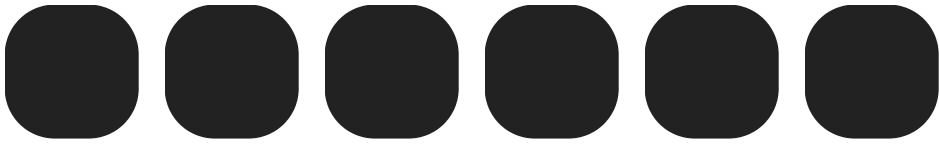
