Gates open at 5:00 p.m. each night except on Saturday, the gates will open at noon with rides beginning at 1 p.m.. Admission is \$5.00 per adults with 6 and under for free. Events start at 7:00 p.m. unless otherwise noted.

Sunday, September 18th - All exhibit (except livestock) entries accepted between 1 p.m. - 4 p.m. Fair Pageants on the Main Stage at 2:00 p.m.

Monday, September 19th - All exhibits (except livestock) judged; Livestock Entries accepted from 3 p.m. - 7 p.m. both large and small animals

Tuesday, September 20th - Parade, downtown Dexter at 5:30 p.m.; Arena A-Youth Games (Directly after parade around 7 p.m.) Ages 12 & under; Entertainment on the Main Stage is Karaoke with youth and adults beginning at 7 p.m.

Wednesday, September 21st - Sheep and Goats Judging at 6:00 p.m.; Entertainment on the Main Stage at 7:00 p.m. with the Joyful Noise Gospel Quartet; Entertainment as the Ground Act are the Robinson Chainsaw Wood Carvers at 7:00 p.m.
