Other than by her mother, she was preceded in death by her son, Ben Kirkpatrick; and by her sister, Carol Brown.

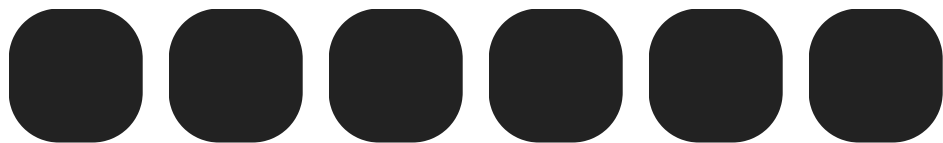
