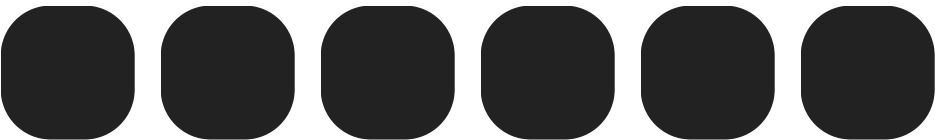
He was preceded in death other than by his parents and his first wife, by two brothers, Bob Stone and Bill Stone. By one grandson, Caleb Redden Murphy.

Other than by her parents, she was preceded in death by her son, Rex Broaddus.

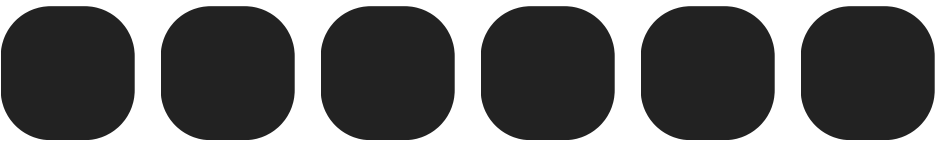

Now, McKinley, not being a basketball player, would follow the other boys to the Johns' house. There he and Mae found that they kind of liked one another. The attraction grew to where they began taking walks together and spending more time in each other's company.
