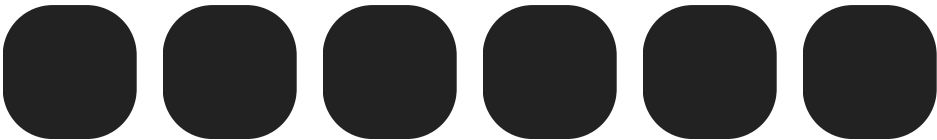
Burial will follow on Wednesday, February 14, 2024, in Cape County Memorial Park Cemetery, in Cape Girardeau, Missouri, 63701.

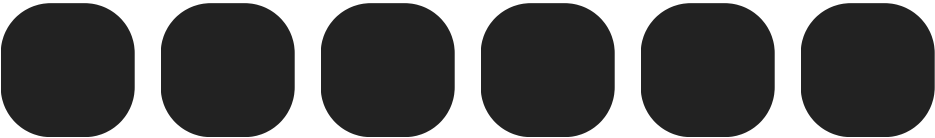
