Other than her parents, Sheila was preceded in death by her brother, David Dick.

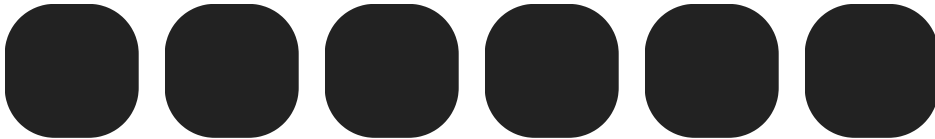
