Guethle's office is located at First Midwest Bank's main bank location on Business US 60 in Dexter.

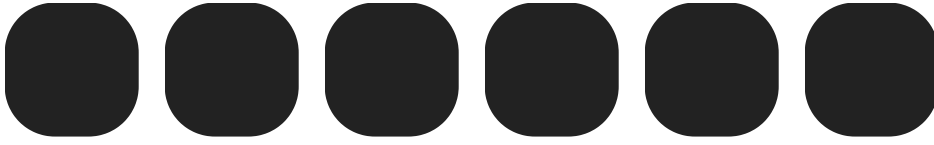

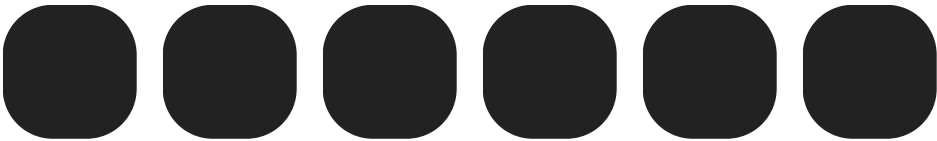
Had he been notified in advance, he undoubtedly would have attempted to redirect the award to someone else, showcasing the selflessness that characterizes this extraordinary man.

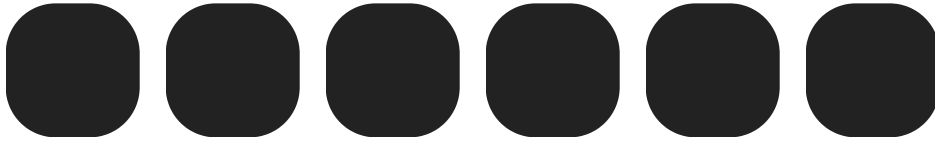
In honoring Ashley today, we also pay tribute to the spirit of community that unites us.

Jessica Jinkerson is more than an exceptional educator;

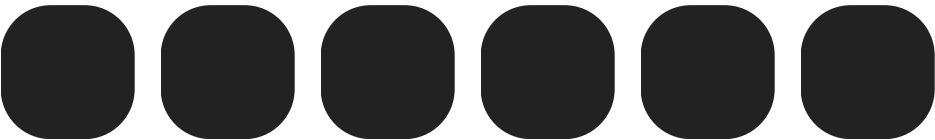
she's a force whose impact transcends the confines of the school walls. Dexter is undoubtedly fortunate to have such an incredible educator in our midst.

This entire journey commenced with an extraordinary little girl and her remarkable parents.

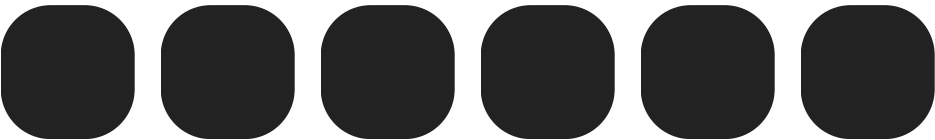
Thanks to the presence of Ms. Emma, our entire community has been enriched by the invaluable contributions of Bootheel Pediatric Therapy and the Worley family.
