
God in East Prairie at 12:00 p.m. with Pastor Dawn Walters officiating. Interment will follow at the Dogwood Cemetery near East Prairie.

Services to honor Randal's life will be held at Watkins Funeral Homes in Dexter, Missouri on Wednesday, April 3, 2024.


The visitation will take place from 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM followed by the funeral service at 11:00 AM.
