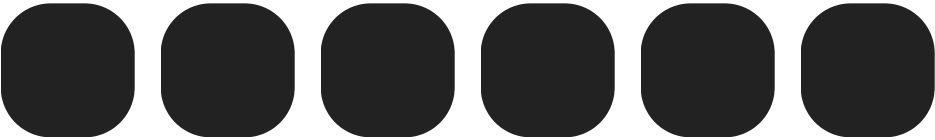

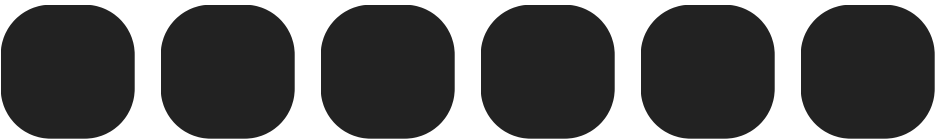
Interment will follow in the New Morley Cemetery in Morley, Missouri.

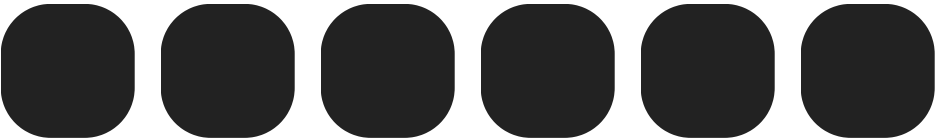
