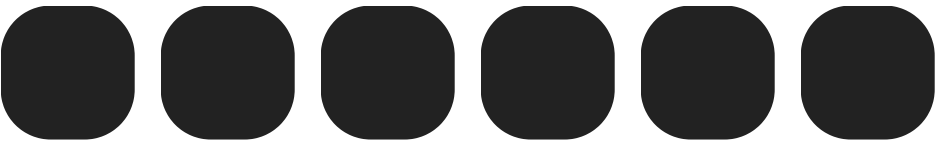

Other than by her husband and parents she was preceded in death by her brother, Joe Montgomery, and by twin grandchildren.

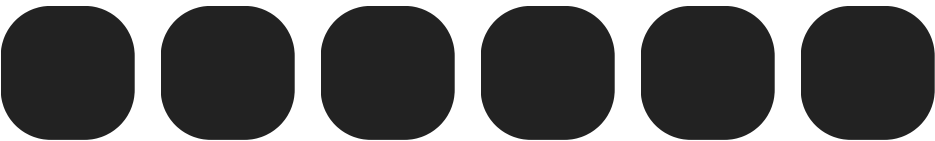

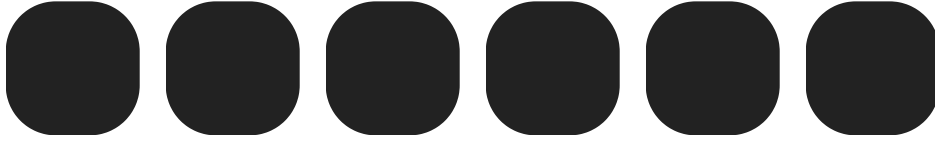
Other than by her mother, she was preceded in death by her step-mother, Kathy Smith.

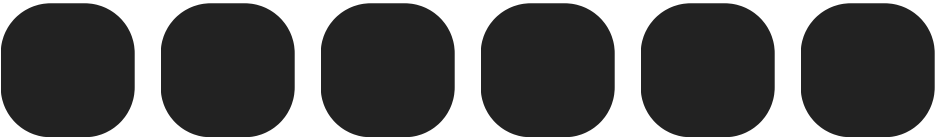
Cemetery in Jackson, Missouri.
