Cemetery in Parma, Missouri. The service will take place from 2:00 PM to 3:00 PM.

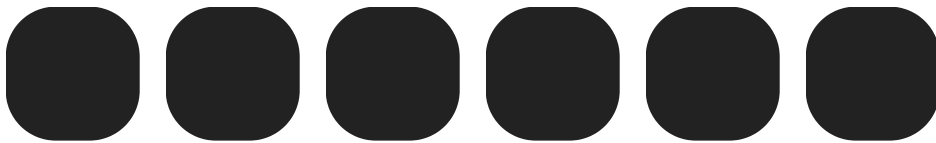
