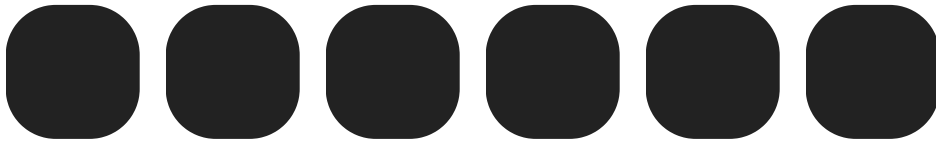
Missouri State Veterans Cemetery in Bloomfield, Missouri.

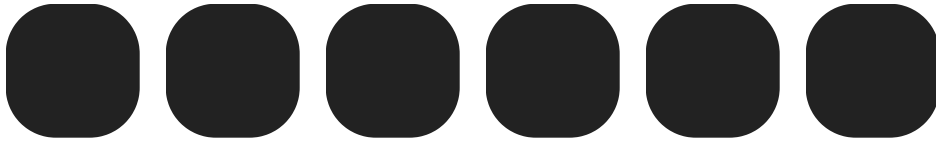

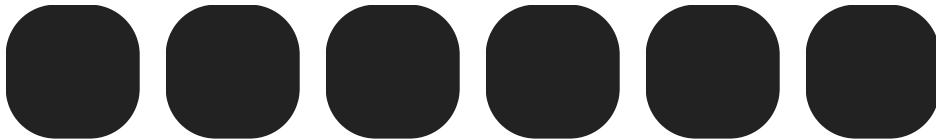
He was preceded in death by his father, Wendell Smith.
