Celebration of Life will be held August 16 in Puxico, Missouri.

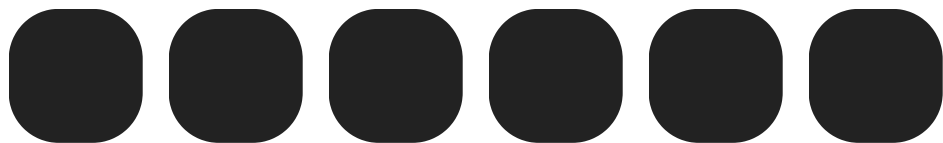

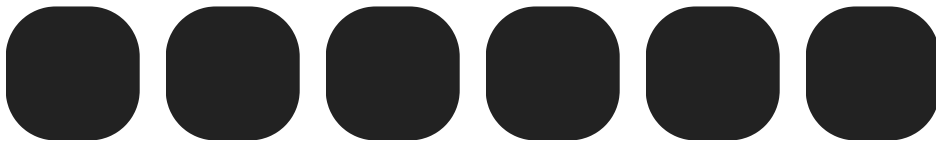
Other than by her parents, she was preceded in death by two brothers, Jim Wade III, and Robert Wade.

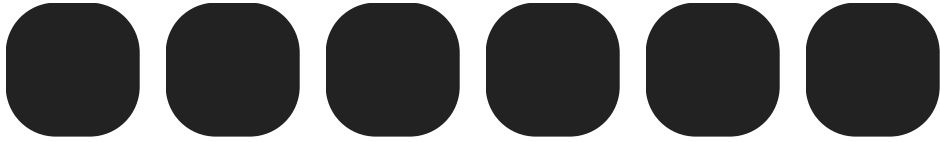
