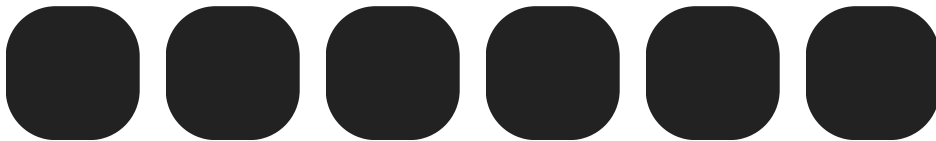

Celebration of Life will be held August 16 in Puxico, Missouri.

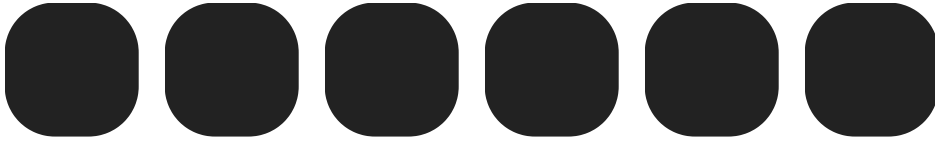

She was united in marriage to Donald Reazin on December 8, 2012 in Bloomfield, Missouri. Mr. Reazin survives of their home in Dexter.

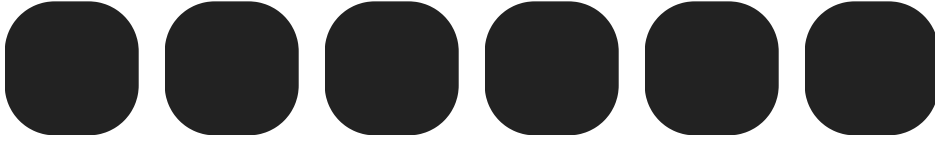

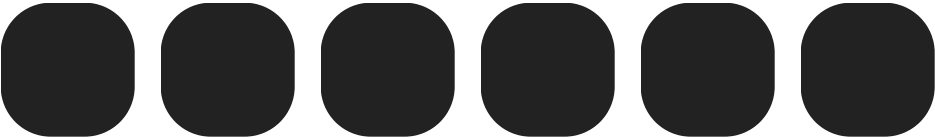
