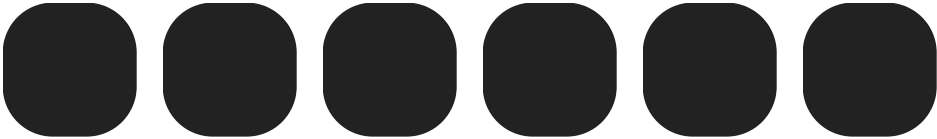
Sherrye married the love of her life Paul Walton on October 15, 1990 in Memphis, Tennessee and remained married until the time of her passing.

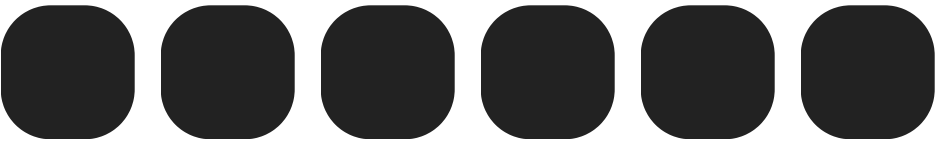
