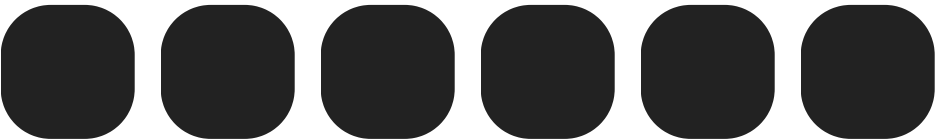
will follow in the Missouri State Veterans Cemetery in Bloomfield.

Other than by his parents, he was preceded in death by his sister, Linda Howard.

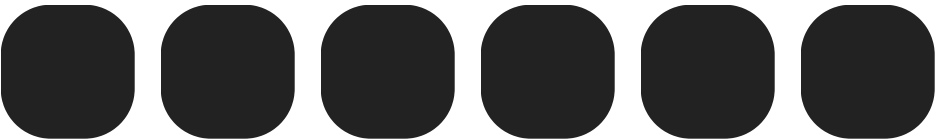

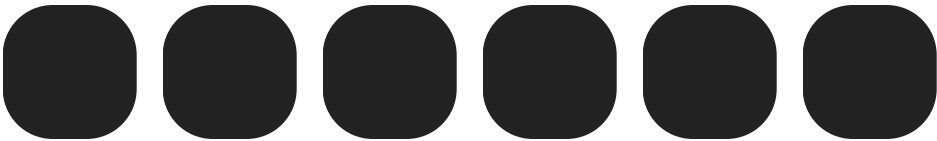
