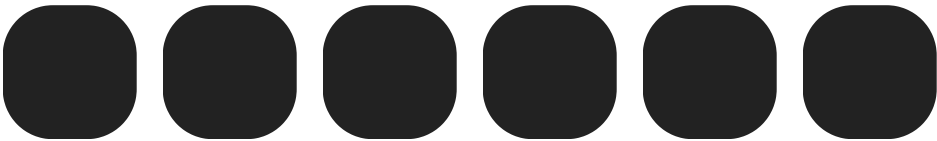

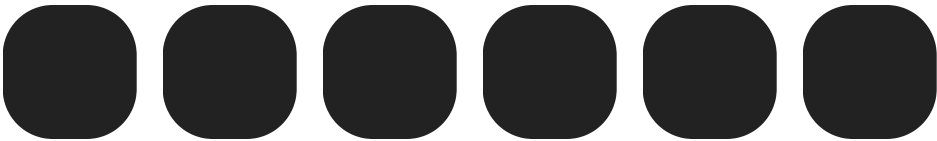

Other than by her father, she was preceded in death by her maternal grandparents, Norman Tanner and Mary Tanner Durall.

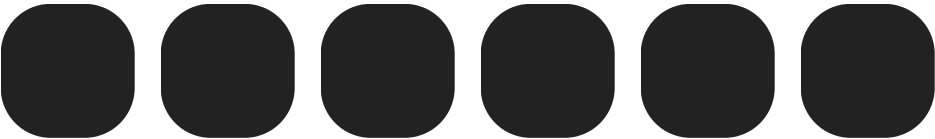
