Other than by her parents, she was preceded in death by her daughter, Carrie Hatton.

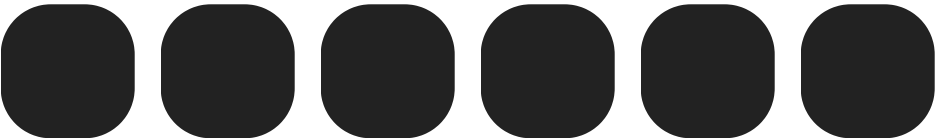

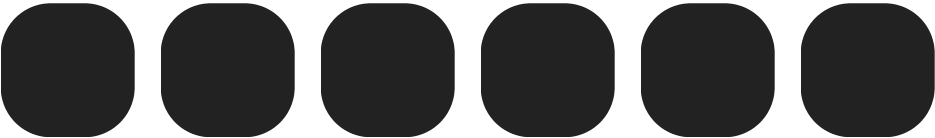
