This grant will provide equipment for the new Bootheel Technical Training Center to support hands-on workforce training in electrical, HVAC, manufacturing, and welding trades. This EDA investment will be matched with \$250,000 in local funds.

private sectors to create an economic development roadmap to strengthen the regional economy, support private capital investment and create jobs.
