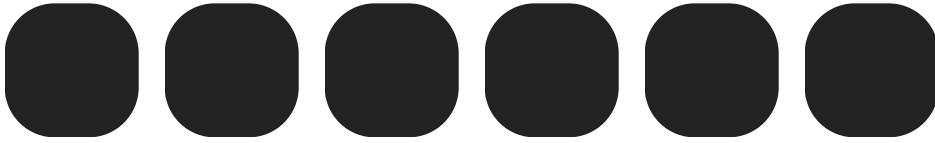

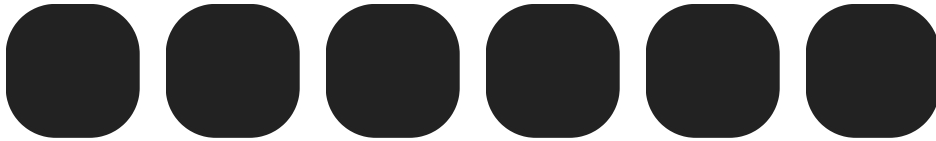

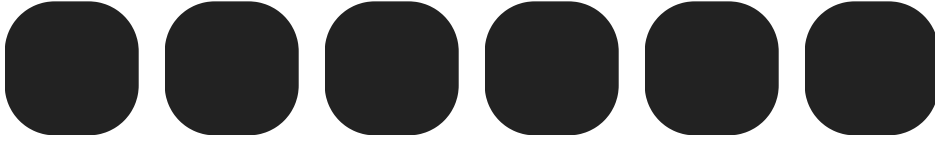
Daniel's life was a testament to hard work and family devotion. His memory will be cherished by all who knew him, and his influence will continue to guide his family and friends.

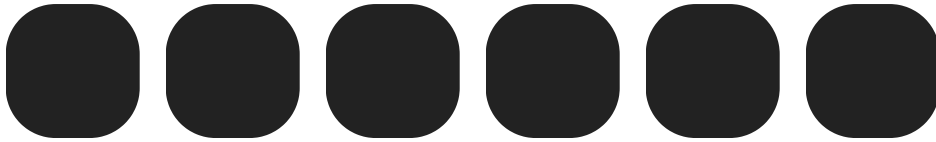
