Jerry was preceded in death by his beloved daughter, Kimberly, a brother, Jessie Earl, and a sister, Karen Sue.

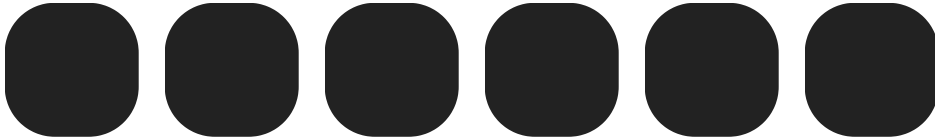
No further arrangements have been made at this time.
