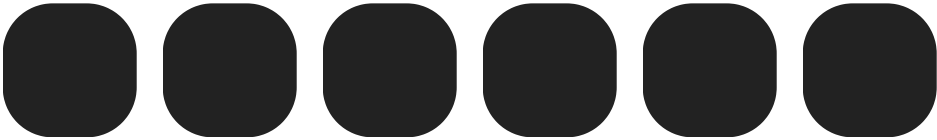

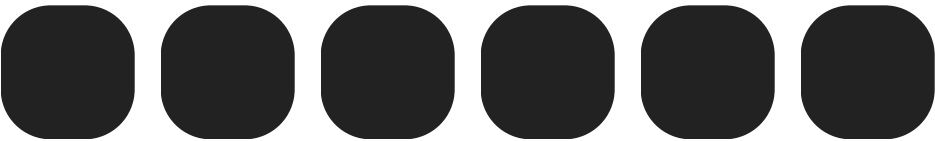

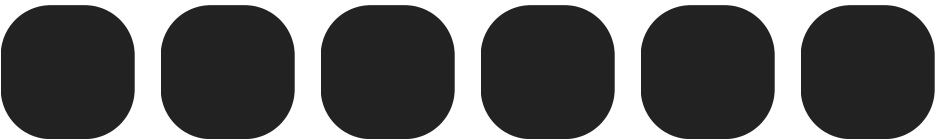
Other than by his father he was preceded in death by his sister, Jennifer Vanatta.
