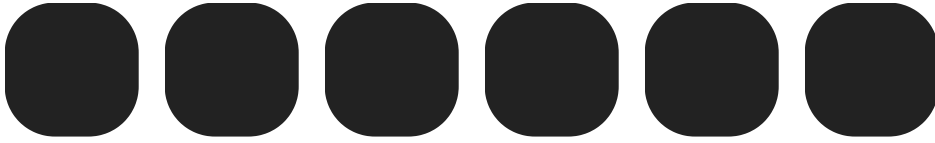

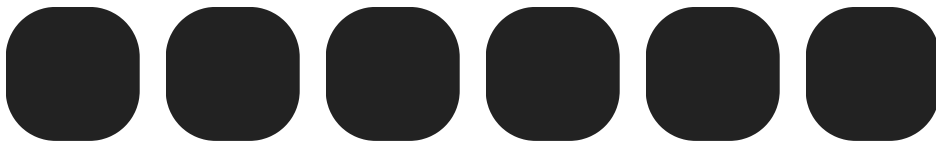
January 23, 2025, at 1:00 p.m. Interment will follow at the Missouri State Veterans Cemetery in Bloomfield, Missouri.

On September 14, 2006, she was united in marriage to Larry Kern in Destin, Florida. Mr. Kern survives in their home in Cape Girardeau, Missouri.

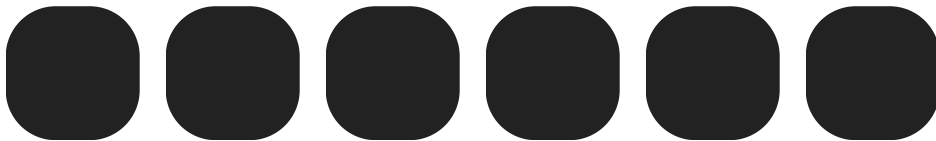

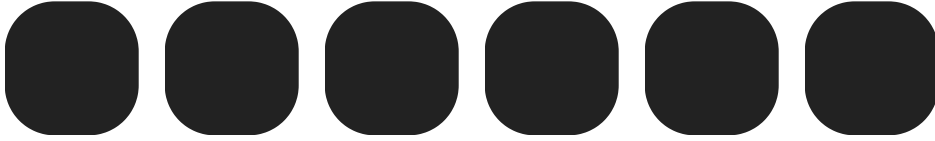
Thelma was preceded in death by her parents, her husband Cecil, 1 sister, and 4 brothers.
