Larie was preceded in death by his parents, Clyde and Alma Burdine, and his sister, Mary Burdine Percy.

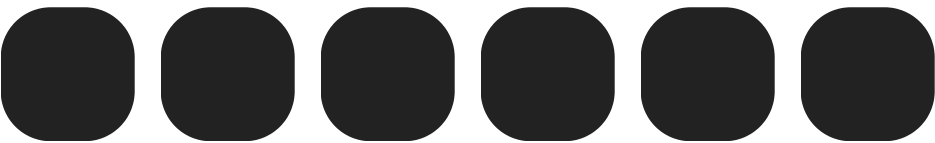
Larie's legacy is one of faithfulness—to God, to his family, and to every community he served. He will be deeply missed but remembered with love and gratitude.

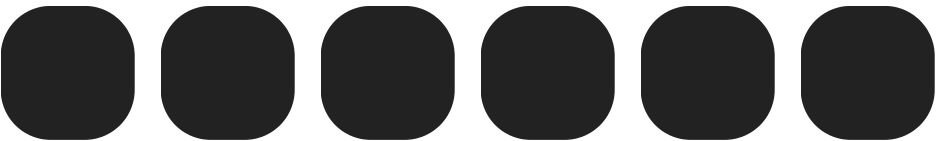

Elvena's legacy of love, kindness, and strength will live on in the hearts of those who had the privilege of knowing and loving her.

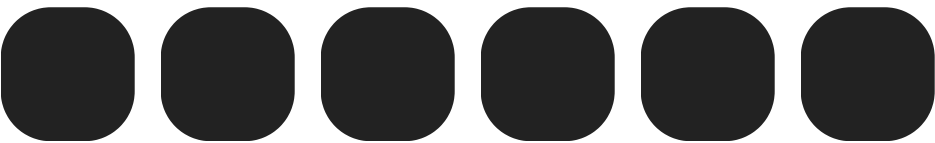

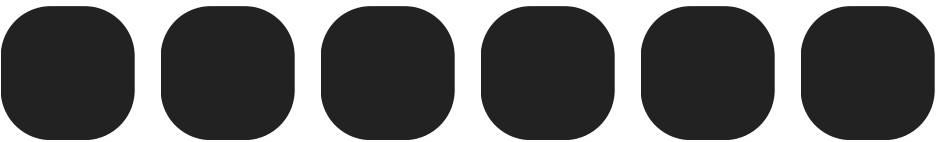
